

Every Tuesday morning we have a staff meeting where we check in on and pray for one another. It feels like almost every



Fall Youth Retreat at Bluewater Covenant Bible Camp





Apologetics Conference



Every November our youth group has a great time attending the Reality Apologetics Conference in Minneapolis and this year was no exception. We brought 12 youth and met up with thousands of others to worship together and learn from some phenomenal speakers. Today's youth are constantly being hit with questions from social media, peers, and culture, all with the intent to lead them away from God. This conference is designed specifically to address those hard questions from a Biblical view. Questions like "Does the Bible condone slavery?" "Does the Bible condone genocide?" "Does the Bible condone the mistreatment of women?" and "Is the Bible reliable at all?"



The theme for Bluewater in 2024 was "Made New." The theme verse was 2 Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old things passed away; behold new things have come." Students were encouraged to live the new life that Christ has given and leave the old life behind. Students were challenged to not stay the same

As we all know, life can be difficult and it's not any easier just because we are followers of Christ. Students came to camp with life experiences of broken families, friends committing suicide, and everything else that life throws at them. But, through the Holy Spirit and Christ's light shining through His body, lives were transformed. Healing was seen (both physical and emotional), transformation was seen in some of the toughest youth, and 39 youth prayed to receive Christ for the first time.

For the third year in a row, Bluewater set a new record for the number of youth campers with 1,139. 39 students decided to follow Jesus for the first time and 319 students decided to recommit their life to Christ. The high number of youth at the early camps creates a need for staff to be trained well and early, especially this year with so many new staff. Despite these difficulties, the staff served well and with unity. The large early camps also meant that the girl's leadership in training (LIT) had to be pushed to later in the summer.

Around camp, the new speaker's/cook's cabin is in the process of being built. The building exterior is water tight, the electrical has been roughed in, and the plumbing will be roughed in next. The current speaker's cabin has been remodeled into a new youth cabin. The walls are ready for mudding/taping, then it just has to be painted and finished.


